ESTONIA is a country in the Baltic region of Northern Europe. It is bordered to the north by the Gulf of Finland, to the west by the Baltic Sea, to the south by Latvia, and to the east by Lake Peipus and Russia. The territory of Estonia covers 45 227 km² and the population is 1,3 million. In 2004 Estonia joined the European Union.

Estonia is famous as **e-country**. "e-Estonia" is the term commonly used to describe Estonia's emergence as one of the most advanced e-societies in the world. For citizens of Estonia, e-services have become routine: e-ticket, e-parking, e-elections, e-taxes, e-police, e-healthcare, e-banking, e-government and e-school are only some of these. Also, Estonia is to become the first country to offer e-residency to people around the world. Skype is probably the most modern and well known Estonian invention in the world today.

TALLINN is the capital and the largest city of Estonia. The population of Tallinn is more than 430 000 (one third of Estonia's total population). Tallinn is situated in the northern coast of Estonia, on the banks of the Gulf of Finland.

City rights were given to Tallinn in 1248. **Tallinn's medieval Old Town** is known around the world for its well-preserved completeness and authentic Hanseatic architecture. Tallinn has managed to wholly preserve its structure of medieval and Hanseatic origin: original cobblestone streets dotted with medieval churches and grandiose merchant houses, barns and warehouses some of which date back as far as the 11th century. In 1997, Tallinn Old Town became a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site and is often referred to as the "medieval pearl of Europe".

NÕMME is one of the 8 administrative districts of Tallinn. The district mostly consists of private houses and is known as the "forest city."

Nõmme was founded by **Nikolai von Glehn**, the owner of Jälgimäe Manor, in 1878 as a summer-house district. The development started around the railway station. In 1926 Nõmme was granted town rights. In 1940 it was unified to Tallinn.

There are many historical sights in Nõmme, like Glehn's Castle, Kalevipoeg sculpture (also known as "Glehn's Devil"), Nõmme Market. Additionally to the historical sights there are many *must see* places, like Vanaka hill, ski jumping tower, Pääsküla Bog etc.

NÕMME KABEKLUBI (Nõmme Draughts Club) was established in 1994. The main purpose of the club has been the development of draughts in Nõmme, especially among young people. Heinar Jahu has been the coach of the club during all that time.

Nõmme Draughts Club is a member of the Estonian Draughts Federation.

The club organizes a variety of events and competitions where in addition to club members also players from other Estonian draughts clubs and abroad can participate. International Tournament "Nõmme Kevad" (international draughts), and an open tournament "Nõmme Sügis" (64 square draughts) have been organized already for 20 years.

Players from Nõmme Draughts Club have been successfully participating in Tallinn and in Estonian championships, in youth and adult competitions, and in the European and World Championships.
